



Therefore, it is essential to not only be concerned about the individual, but also adjust the relationships between the individual and persons around him/her from his/her standpoint.


① The relationships at school or a center

 - → It is important to build relationships among staff in order to consult openly how to understand the individual and support him/her.


2 The relationships between the family and a school or a center





The individual is watching the relationships between staff/teacher and his/her mother.

- If a mother of the individual doesn't open out to staff or have a sense of distrust, it affects the individual.
 - * The mother tends to be put in a vulnerable position, because she commits her child to staff.
 - ⇒ It is important for staff to keep the mother's such feelings in their mind in order to build a trusting relationship, so that parents can express their opinion, request openly, and consult with.

3 Relationships in the family







- a) The individual is watching the relationships between his/her father and mother.
- In cases that a father and a mother understand their child and support him/her differently, or create tensions in the marriage, the individual is confused and shows complicated behaviors.
 - ⇒ It is important for parents to have a relationship in order to discuss with each other openly.
- b) The individual is watching how his/her mother deals with his/her older siblings.
- When the individual's mother scolds his/her siblings, he/she shows complicated behaviors.
- · The individual avoids his/her siblings.
 - * The individual is also watching how his/her father deals with his/her older brother or sister.
 - * If parents focused on dealing with the individual, his/her siblings are forced to be patient.
 - ⇒ It is important for parents to bring siblings into view.
- c) The individual is watching how his/her mother deals with his/her younger siblings.
- When the individual's mother is taking care of his/her younger siblings, he/she can't go near them, and bothers his/her mother.
- The individual avoids his/her younger siblings or hit them.
- The individual becomes irritated and grumpy, when his/her siblings cry.
 - * The individual is also watching how his/her father deals with his/her younger brother or sister.
 - * The individual often holds him/her back, because his/her younger brother or sister wants their mother's attention strongly.
 - □ It is necessary for parents to understand that the individual doesn't know how to express his/her feelings,

so holds his/her feelings back.
